

Jovid Foundation Grants Awarded in 2003

In 2003, the Foundation's grants fell into five areas: Employment and Training Programs; Economic and Poverty Research; Performing Arts; Foundation/Nonprofit Institutional Support; and, Other. In 2003, the Foundation awarded grants to 48 organizations which totaled \$603,900. Grants paid during 2003 totaled \$519,400.
